

About Wooramel Station

WOORAMEL RIVER RETREAT DRIVEWAY←→

Wooramel River Retreat is a family-owned, 356,000-acre working cattle and goat station offering an authentic outback experience. Located along the North West Coastal Highway, the property spans 1,430 square kilometers, boasting 60 kilometers of Indian Ocean coastline and bordering the Shark Bay World Heritage Area.

A distinctive feature of the station is the Wooramel River, often referred to as an "upside-down river" due to its surface flow occurring only two to three times a year after significant inland rainfall.

This intermittent flow nourishes floodplains, providing rich grazing land alongside coastal plains with native saltbush and bluebush pastures. The remainder of the property is characterized by Wanyu and Acacia bushland.

The station's history dates back to the early 1880s but it was not until the 1920s, under the ownership of the Hall family that drilling for artesian water began, unlocking vast resources for livestock, three bores were drilled, supplying naturally pressurized artesian water from a depth of 240 meters to the majority of the property via free flowing bore drains.

Since acquiring the station in 1987, the Steadman family has implemented sustainable land management practices to rejuvenate the rangeland ecosystem.

Transitioning from Merino sheep to Damara-Dorper breeds better suited to arid conditions, they also established an international goat trade to manage the transient goat population and reduce grazing pressure.

In recent years, sheep have been removed entirely, and strategic fencing has been introduced to control grazing. Cattle and goats are now utilized to naturally prune perennial shrubs and grasses, enhancing the land's regenerative capacity, especially following rainfall.

- EVERYBODY LOVES A CLEAN SHOWER, PLEASE USE THE BROOM WITH WATER SQUEEGEE TO WIPE DOWN BATHROOM FLOORS WHEN YOU FINISH.
- PLEASE PUT ALL RUBBISH INCLUDING BUTTS AND BOTTLE TOPS IN THE BINS PROVIDED
- ONE PERSONS TRASH IS ANOTHERS TREASURE BUT PLEASE DO NOT REMOVE ANY TREASURES FROM OUR HISTORICAL TIP. BREAKAGES WILL BE CHARGED.
- WEAR ONLY OLD OR DARK COLOURED BATHERS IN BATH TO PREVENT STAINING.
- IF YOU NEED YOUR FIRE PIT EMPTIED PLEASE CONTACT RECEPTION.
- NO DRONES ALLOWED DUE TO PROXIMITY OF AIR STRIP AND PRIVACY.
